### Postgame Football Notes – San Diego State vs. UNLV

November 10, 2018

SDCCU Stadium | San Diego, Calif.

#### Big Notes

- The Aztecs' projected starting backfield coming into the season - QB Christian Chapman, RB Juwan Washington and FB Isaac Lessard - each started together for the first time since the team's second game of the season against Sacramento State on Sept. 8.
- SDSU played in its eighth straight game decided by one score (eight points or less), which is the longest active FBS streak and longest since UCLA had an eight-game streak in 2000. San Diego State is 6-2 in those games (UCLA was 3-5).

#### Streaks Snapped

- 7-game home win streak. Entering the game today, SDSU's seven-game home winning streak was tied for the 12<sup>th</sup>-longest active streak in FBS play.
- 4-game win streak against UNLV
- 8-game home win streak against UNLV

#### Team Notes

- SDSU has still won seven of its last nine games (7-2), 19 of its last 25 (19-6), 25 of its last 33 (25-8), 38 of its last 47 (38-9) and 39 since the 2015 season (39-12).
- The Aztecs dropped to 26-6 in their last 32 regular-season Mountain West games and 28-6 in their last 34 against Mountain West opponents (includes MW Championship games).
- San Diego State dropped to 8-2 in its last 10 MW games.
- San Diego State fell to 67-17 in the Rocky Long era when scoring just 20 or more points.
- The Aztecs had held their opponents to under 400 yards of total offense in nine consecutive games until tonight, which was the third-longest active streak in FBS play.
- SDSU recovered just its second fumble all season in the third quarter.
- San Diego State allowed UNLV to convert a third-and-20 situation, the longest allowed by SDSU all season.
- SDSU was outrushed for just the second time in 10 games this season.

#### Series Notes

- San Diego State fell to 18-10 all-time against UNLV.
- The Aztecs have still won four of the last five (4-1) against the Rebels, seven of the last nine (7-2) and 13 of the last 17 (13-4).
- SDSU saw its four-game winning streak snapped against the Rebels and their eight-game home winning streak vs. UNLV snapped.
- San Diego State is now 11-4 all-time against the Rebels at home.

## Trends

- SDSU started with the ball for the 81<sup>st</sup> time in the last 94 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 153 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 275).
- SDSU allowed its opponent to score on its opening drive for just the 12<sup>th</sup> time since 2015 (51 games).
- SDSU threw an interception in the first quarter, snapping a streak of 120 passes without a pick.
- San Diego State scored a touchdown in the second quarter, making it 13 out of the last 15 second quarters that SDSU has scored a touchdown.
- The Aztecs fell to 5-2 this season and 50-11 in the Rocky Long era when leading at the half.
- SDSU fell to 3-1 this season and 59-12 in the Rocky Long era when leading after three quarters.

## Player Notes

### \* **Tim Wilson Jr, So., WR (5 rec., 123 yds., 2 TD)**

- Set career highs with five receptions, 123 receiving yards and two touchdowns.
- Became SDSU's first 100-yard receiver since Fred Trevillon had 128 against Boise State on Oct. 14, 2017.
- Is the 84<sup>th</sup> different 100-yard receiver in SDSU history (323<sup>rd</sup> occasion overall).
- Recorded his second and third touchdown catch of the season and of his career (also had one vs. No. 23/25 Arizona State on Sept. 15).

### \* **Juan Washington, Jr, RB (21 att., 66 yds., 1 TD)**

- Rushed for 66 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries.
- Recorded his eighth rushing touchdown of the season (in six games) and 21<sup>st</sup> of his career.
- Now has eight overall touchdowns this year and 25 for his career.
- Now has 25 touchdowns (21 rushing, three kick return, one receiving) over his last 26 games played.

### \* **Christian Chapman, Sr., QB (8-for-10, 92 yds., 1 TD, 1 INT)**

- Threw for 92 yards, going 8-for-10 with a touchdown and an interception.
- Started for the first time since the second game of the season against Sacramento State on Sept. 18
- Threw his second touchdown of the second and 37<sup>th</sup> of his career.
- Dropped to 24-8 all-time as a starting quarterback.

### \* **Ryan Agnew, Jr., QB (14-for-26, 187 yds., 1 TD, 1 INT)**

- Threw for 187 yards and a touchdown, going 14-for-26.
- The touchdown was his eighth of the season (and career).

### \* **Ethan Dedeaux, RS-Fr., WR (7 rec., 63 yds.)**

- Had a career-high seven receptions for 63 yards in his first start since Oct. 6 at No. 14/24 Boise State.

### \* **Kyahva Tezino, Jr., LB (14 tackles (9 solo), 1.0 TFL)**

- Had a game-high 14 tackles (nine solo) and a tackle for loss.
- Led the team in tackles for the fifth consecutive game, eighth time this season (in 10 games) and the 12<sup>th</sup> time of his career (all of which have come over his last 15 outings).
- Has 154 tackles and 16.5 tackles for loss over his last 15 games (first career 15 starts).
- Recorded his fifth double-digit tackle game this season and seventh of his career.

**\* Parker Baldwin, Sr., AZ (9 tackles, 1 FR)**

- Had nine tackles and a fumble recovery.
- The fumble recovery was his first of the season and second of his career.
- The nine tackles were the second most on the team.

**Other Notes**

- CB Ron Smith started for the 29<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 51<sup>st</sup> straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- SDSU's captains tonight were QB Christian Chapman (second time this year), AZ Parker Baldwin (sixth time this year), K John Baron (ninth time this year) and LB Ronley Lakalaka (fifth time this year).
- WAR Trenton Thompson had his first career interception.
- WAR Tariq Thompson recorded his first forced fumble of the season and second of his career.
- LB Troy Cassidy picked up his first career forced fumble.
- Tonight's temperature was 61 degrees, the coldest SDSU home game since a 53-degree game vs. Colorado State on Nov. 26, 2016.
- Tonight's attendance was 24,986.
- Tonight's Aztec Honor Warrior was Leon McFadden (2009-12).
